DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 14,949, dated April 8, 1884

Application filed February 15, 1884. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES E. HEYER, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city of Chicago, county of Cook, and State of Illinois, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Font of Printing-Type, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying typographical illustration, forming a part hereof.

10 The character of the face is ornamental, of the so-called "Gothic" design, and consists of capitals, lower-case, figures, points, end ornament, and one catch-word, and also six duplicate letters—capitals A C H and lower-case

15 m n r. A special feature of all the capitals, figures, short and, dollar-mark, lower-case e f g h m n r v w y, and catch-word "and" is a

diagonal hair-line ending with a disk or scroll, which hair-line runs either through or from a certain part of the letter, as shown. All letters, figures, and points, excepting capitals D O, lower-case o, and cipher, have their end strokes mitered to about forty-five degrees, either on top or bottom, which end strokes on all the capital letters run either above or below the general line of the letter.

I claim—

The design for a font of printing-type, as described and shown in the accompanying typographical illustration.
