

DESIGN FOR A FONT OF TYPE-BORDER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,821, dated May 6, 1890.

Application filed December 18, 1889. Serial No. 334,220. Term of patent 31/2 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Rudolph Gnichwitz, a citizen of the United States, residing at Ashbourne, in the county of Montgomery and State of Pennsylvania, and Edwin C. Ruthven, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Font of Type-10 Border, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

The leading feature of our design for a font of type-border is the checkered face thereof. In the drawings, A designates a font of type-border embodying our design. In the border-sections represented by 1, 4, 13, and 14 the checkered face is formed by the intersec-

tion of surface-lines of different shade arranged at angles. In the sections represented 20 by 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, and 17 the checkered face is in like manner produced by lines of different shade, but have distinguishing borders, block-face lines, and enlarged checkered configurations. In the sections represented by 11 and 12 the checkered configuration is obtained by the intersection of eccentric and concentric circular lines.

We claim—

A design for a font of type-border, as shown 30 and described.
