DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 20,057, dated July 29, 1890.

Application filed June 17, 1890. Serial No. 355,805. Term of patent 31/2 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUDOLPH GNICHWITZ, a citizen of the United States, residing at Ashbourne, in the county of Montgomery and 5 State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for a Font of Printing-Type, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

This design comprises the leading features following, namely: first, spiral ornamentation running through the capitals and logotypes; second, pen-sketch lower-case with spiral ornamentation in c, f, g, j, k, r, s, v, w, x, y, and z; third, open tops in lower-case a, g, and q, and, fourth, triangular cross on lower-case t.

The accompanying drawing shows upper and lower case letters, punctuation-marks, logotypes, and numerals illustrative of my design.

As will be observed from inspection of the 20 drawing, the capitals have one or another of their limbs formed as a spiral, as at a in A, and as at b in Y. The I remains plain. In the lower-case, c, f, g, j, k, r, s, v, w, x, y, and z have the spiral ornamentation, as at a. The 25 logotypes likewise have the spiral ornamentation. In the lower-case, also, a, g, and q are open at the top, as at a. The t of the lower-case is made with a triangular cross.

What I claim is—

The design for a font of printing-type, substantially as shown and described.
