DESIGN FOR PRINTING-TYPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 13,092, dated July 25, 1882.

Application filed May 26, 1882. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I WILLIAM W. JACKSON,
(assignor to MACKELLAR, SMITHS & JORDAN,) of the city and county of Philadelphia, Penn-
sylvania, have invented and produced a new
and original Design for a Font of Printing-
Type, of which the following is a specification.
The nature of my design is clearly shown
in the accompanying typographic impression,
to which reference is made; and it consists
of a heavy unshaded letter somewhat of the
class known as "mediæval," the up and down
portions of which, as in the C, G, O, and Q,
are inclined upon the left in the C and G, and
upon the left and right in the O and Q to a
central point, while the upper and lower por-
tions of all the letters save the U, V, W, and Y
are horizontal. In the A the left-hand portion
extends below the line and terminates in the
dot upon the left. The cross-line extends to the
left of the up-and-down portion, terminates in
the dot, and is extended to the right and
gradually widens. In the B, C, E, F, G, H, J, K,
L, M, N, P, Q, R, S, T, and Z the dot termination
is also found, as shown. The M is composed of
a heavy central up-and-down portion, from

which extend on each side, forming a continu-
ation of the upper horizontal line, the inclined
sides followed by lighter lines curved inward
and outward with dot termination. The right-
hand portion of the N is similar in design. In
the U the left-hand portion is inclined, and is
followed by a curved portion extended up-
ward, and terminating in the dot, as shown.
In the V the right-hand portion is curved up-
ward to the right, and has the dot termina-
tion, as shown. The W is simply the M re-
versed. In the X the dot termination follows
one portion of the letter, which extends below
the line. In the Y the upper portion has the
dot termination upon the right hand.

The character of the design is preserved in
the numerals.

Having now set forth my invention, what I
claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-type, sub-
stantially as shown and described.
